NEW SCHOOL SAFETY POLICY

Peace River School Division has changed their policy on school safety for the 2023-24 school year. ALL doors to the school will be locked after the first bell (8:50am) in the safety of everyone within. If you need to pick up your child early or are dropping them off from an appointment or are late for school – please use the doorbell and camera at our Main Entrance (Flagpoles location); also, any visitors and volunteers who need access will also need to use the Main Entrance.



STUDENT DROP-OFF & PICK-UP:

Parents dropping off children for school, please instruct your child to use the **Cross Walk** in the *middle of the bus loop OR* drop them off at the *north end of the school yard* near the mailboxes and they will not have to cross roads or the bus lane at all. Students will then proceed directly to the grade appropriate entrance. They should not be using the staff or main entrances. This is very important and a safety issue for the students to be using the crosswalks.



School Cash Accounts

If there are any fees for your child, such as Hockey, Dance & Gymnastics, Yearbook, damaged or lost school textbooks, they will appear on your child's account. 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SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Welcome Back & Recognizing the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation

Welcome back to another school year!

This year, I am looking forward to seeing our students grow and thrive in their school environments while being challenged in their studies and extracurricular activities. As a team, it is the goal of the PRSD to be role models for your children. Each person on the PRSD team has been challenged to model characteristics and virtues that are inspiring to both the students and the communities we serve. More than anything though, our goal is to help students understand they can achieve success. It is my personal belief that there is no greater gift a person can give than the gift of education.

Currently, schools are participating in Terry Fox events across the division, raising funds for cancer research. Terry Fox was once quoted saying, "When I started this run, I said that if we all gave one dollar, we'd have \$22 million for cancer research, and I don't care man, there's no reason that isn't possible. No reason." Since 1980, the Terry Fox Foundation has raised more than \$850 million for cancer research. In 2021–22, the Terry Fox Foundation funded \$14.1 million in cancer research, including \$1.3 million for paediatric and young adult cancer research.

As September nears its end, we are fast approaching the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, September 30. Across the division, all our schools are engaged in learning activities to support healing and understanding between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples. The PRSD is committed to doing their part to provide avenues for Indigenous people and Elders to share their history, their culture, and the truth of Canada's history. We are committed to honouring residential school survivors, the children who never returned home, their families, and their communities.

Earlier this month, Hines Creek Composite and Fairview High School welcomed Qye7e (pronounced Kin-ah-ah and meaning Great-Grandmother in Secwepemc) Cecilia DeRose and Kye7e (pronounced Kee-ya-ah and meaning Grandmother in Secwepemc) Lulu Ostrem from the Secwepemc First Nation in the Williams Lake, BC area. Qye7e is an esteemed Elder who attended the St. Joseph residential school. In 2013, Qye7e was part of the original Orange Shirt Day ceremony held at St. Joseph's. She expressed excitement over the fact that what was once a small ceremony has become an internationally recognized symbol of the legacy of residential schools.

At the September 21 regular meeting of the Board of Trustees a motion was approved to designate the week of September 30 as Truth and Reconciliation Week.

In addition to visits from Elders, PRSD schools have engaged in, or will take part in, a variety of other meaningful opportunities to learn about Indigenous cultures.

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Some examples of these events include traditional Métis fiddling lessons, lunch with Bannock, participating in Indigenous games, and the sharing of Indigenous stories.

The PRSD recognizes that learning about Indigenous culture shouldn't be limited to one day, one week or even one month per year, and as such, are committed to engaging in activities that promote learning about Indigenous history and cultures all year round.

If you are looking for ways to support your child's understanding of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation at home, there is a resource available online through the First Nations Child and Family Caring Society called, "<u>Spirit Bear's Guide to the Truth</u> and Reconciliation Commission of Canada Calls to <u>Action.</u>" This document contains the 94 calls to action, written in plain language and geared towards youth.
