A big thank you to Mr. Pittman, who will be manning the grill for us—it's sure to be a fun and memorable day for everyone involved!



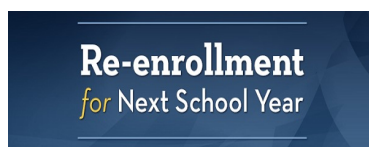
